KITCHEN DESIGN TIPS

1. Layout First — Work Triangle Rules
Prioritize the fridge → sink → stove triangle. Maintain clear pathways (minimum 42" for one cook, 48" for two).



2. Layer Your Lighting Overhead recessed lighting + under-cabinet lights + pendant lights over islands. Use dimmers for flexibility.



3. Cabinet & Drawer Savvy Maximize storage with deep drawers, pull-out trays, lazy Susans. Add vertical dividers for baking sheets and cutting boards.



4. Countertop Continuity Choose durable, low-maintenance materials (quartz is ideal). Carry the countertop material into a full-height backsplash for a seamless, high-end look.



5. Neutral Foundation + Personality Accents Stick to timeless neutrals for big-ticket items (cabinets, counters). Add personality with lighting, barstools, hardware, and decor.

6. Staging Tip: Display simple, natural items — wood cutting boards, a vase of herbs, a bowl of lemons — to evoke warmth and lifestyle.

BATH DESIGN TIPS

1. Optimize the Layout: Maintain at least 30" clearance in front of sinks and toilets. Floating vanities can create a sense of space in smaller baths.



2. Choose Statement Fixtures Upgrade faucets, lighting, and hardware — polished nickel, matte black, or brass are current favorites.



3. Smart Storage: Incorporate recessed niches in showers and medicine cabinets. Consider pairing open shelving with closed storage for a balanced look.



4. Layered Lighting: Use sconces at eye level beside mirrors (not just overhead). Ambient lighting + task lighting = both functional and flattering.



5. Material Harmony: Coordinate metals, tile textures, and cabinetry. Use larger format tiles to make small baths feel larger.

6. Staging Tip: White fluffy towels, fresh flowers, glass jars of bath salts, and a small stool create an inviting spa vibe. GENERAL

Kitchen & Bath Color Palette Cheat Sheet

Timeless Neutrals (Great for Resale Value & Longevity) Whites → Soft white, off-white, creamy white Grays → Warm greige, light dove gray, charcoal Taupes & Beiges → Mushroom taupe, sand beige Black → Matte black for accents & hardware



Accent Colors (Add Life & Interest) Navy Blue → Rich & sophisticated for islands or vanities Sage Green → Calming, earthy, works great in baths Soft Blush → Adds warmth without being too feminine Pewter Blue → Muted, elegant, coastal vibe



Metallic Finishes (For Hardware & Lighting) Brushed Nickel → Safe and versatile Polished Chrome → Modern and crisp Satin Brass or Champagne Bronze → Warm luxury Matte Black → Bold and contemporary



Natural Elements Wood tones → Medium oak, walnut, white oak Stone → Subtle marbles, quartzite, or veined quartz.



GENERAL DESIGN PRINCIPLES

10 Must-Have Accessories for Staging Kitchens & Baths

- Kitchen Wood Cutting Boards — Leaned against backsplash, layered.
- Cookbook on Stand — Adds charm and warmth.
- Bowl of Fresh Lemons or Limes — Instant pop of color.
- Glass Canisters — With pasta, flour, or cookies.
- Stylish Hand Soap & Lotion Duo — Near sink, elevated look.
- Bath Plush White Towels — Rolled or folded spa-style.
- Clear Glass Jars — Filled with bath salts, cotton balls.
- Greenery or Flowers — In a small vase (real or quality faux).
- Wooden or Bamboo Bath Stool/Tray — Adds warmth & texture.
- Luxury Candle — Scented but not overpowering.
- Pro Tip: For both kitchens and baths → less is more when staging! Leave clean negative space to show off surfaces and create an elevated, airy feel.



GENERAL DESIGN PRINCIPLES

- **10 Styling Mistakes to Avoid in Kitchens & Baths Kitchen Mistakes** Too Many Small Appliances on Counters → Keep 1–2 max (e.g., coffee maker + toaster).
- Hide the rest. Busy or Mismatched Counter Decor → Group items in odd numbers and stick to a cohesive color palette. Over-styled Open Shelves → Leave space; use consistent dishware or minimal accessories.
- Outdated or Cluttered Refrigerator Front → No magnets, notes, or kid art during staging. Lack of Focal Point → Create one with statement lighting or a beautiful backsplash. Bath Mistakes Too Much Countertop Clutter → Only display intentional items (soap, greenery, nice towels).
- Cheap or Overly Themed Shower Curtain → Use a crisp white or subtly textured curtain or a glass door. Outdated or Clashing Fixtures → Update to cohesive, modern hardware if budget allows.
- Neglecting to Clean Grout & Caulk → Dingy grout instantly makes a bath look tired. No Sense of Warmth → Add at least one soft element: towels, wood tray, or rug.
- **5 Lighting Ideas That Sell Kitchens & Baths Faster** Pendant Lights Over Kitchen Island → Use statement pendants in metal, glass, or mixed materials for a designer look. Under-Cabinet Kitchen Lighting → Adds both functionality and ambiance — makes kitchens feel high-end.
- Layered Bath Lighting → Combine ceiling light + sconces at mirror height for flattering light. Dimmers Everywhere → Allow buyers to experience spaces at different moods — bright for function, soft for warmth. Warm Light Temperature (2700K–3000K) → Avoid harsh "cool white" or blue-toned lighting — always aim for warm and inviting.



GENERAL DESIGN PRINCIPLES

"Kitchen & Bath Staging Do's & Don'ts" Cheat Sheet — perfect to print, share with clients, or use yourself:

- ✓ Clear off counters (leave just 2–3 tasteful items)
- ✓ Use one focal point — bowl of lemons, fresh flowers, cookbook
- ✓ Turn on all lighting, especially under-cabinet & pendants
- ✓ Clean all surfaces, including cabinets & appliances
- ✓ Display neutral dish towels (no logos or busy prints)
- ✓ Keep sink empty & sparkling clean BATH
- ✓ Hang fresh, white, or neutral towels — spa style
- ✓ Use decorative accessories in threes (plant, candle, glass jar)
- ✓ Clean mirrors & all glass — no streaks
- ✓ Use light, neutral shower curtain or clear glass door
- ✓ Add a touch of greenery or flowers
- ✓ Keep toilet lid down & all personal items out of sight

DON'T'S KITCHEN

- X With appliances, utensils, or decor
- X Leave dish racks, dirty dishes, or trash visible
- X Display personal items or children's artwork on fridge
- X Use bright or busy-colored towels
- X Forget to light dark corners

DON'T'S BATH

- X Leave shampoo, soap, or razors in the shower
- X Use worn or mismatched towels
- X Display themed or cartoon shower curtains
- X Forget to check grout and caulk condition
- X Use too many scented items — subtle is better

Pro Stager's Tip: ✨ Aim for neutral, inviting, and lifestyle-driven spaces. Buyers should feel like they've stepped into a magazine — clean, fresh, and full of potential.

PRE-CONSTRUCTION PHASE (2–4 weeks)

Final Measurements & Drawings 3–5 days

Permits & HOA Approvals (if needed) 1–2 weeks

Material & Product Ordering Overlaps — allow 2–6 weeks for delivery



CONSTRUCTION PHASE

(Kitchen Remodel + Bath Remodel can be run in parallel or staggered, depending on crew size & client needs — here shown as parallel)



KITCHEN REMODEL (6–10 weeks typical)

Demolition & Site Prep 2–4 days

Rough Framing & Structural (if applicable) 2–4 days

Plumbing Rough-In 2–4 days

Electrical Rough-In 2–4 days

Inspection (Plumbing & Electrical) 1–3 days

Insulation & Drywall 4–6 days

Flooring Install 3–5 days

Cabinet Installation 3–5 days

Countertop Templating 1 day (wait for install — usually 7–10 business days after template)

Countertop Installation 1 day

Backsplash Tile Installation 2–3 days

Appliance Installation 1–2 days

Finish Electrical & Plumbing (fixtures, lights, faucet hookup) 2–3 days

Final Punch List & Touch-Ups 2–5 days

Paint & Wall Finishes 2–3 days

Final Punch List & Touch-Ups 2–4 days
